## 2013 Guest Artist Si Kahn

The Alaska Folk Festival is pleased and excited to announce singer, songwriter, & activist, **Si Kahn** has been chosen to be guest artist at next year's festival. Si Kahn songs have been sung so widely and for so long that many have thought they were traditional folk songs. His songs have been recorded by more than 100 artists and translated into half a dozen languages. Such classics as Aragon Mill (aka Weave and Spin), Gone Gonna Rise Again, Go To Work On Monday, and Rubber Blubber Whale have become part of the oral tradition, and are sung in folk clubs and living rooms around the world.

Si's musical body of work includes 15 albums of original songs for adults and children, plus a collection of traditional labor and civil rights songs recorded with Pete Seeger and Jane Sapp. One of Si's best musical experiences was when publisher Harper-Collins had him set to music and record the classic children's books Runaway Bunny and Goodnight Moon.

At its annual conference in 2011, the Folk Alliance gave Si a special Triple Crown award, recognizing him as the #1 Artist for the previous year, and for having both the #1 CD and the #1 Song. Si has performed at concerts and festivals in Portugal, the Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, England, Northern Ireland, Canada and the U.S. He has toured, shared stages and recorded with such artists as Pete Seeger, NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION U.S. POSTAGE PAID Juneau, AK Permit #194
