So Where is the Application Form?

As announced in the last newsletter, we are departing from the long tradition of pre-printed application forms being included with this newsletter. This year you will have 3 options of how to submit your Performer, Workshop, Dance Band, Caller and/or Volunteer application forms.

- 1) You may apply directly from our website by filling out an online form. For most folks this is the fastest and most simple.
- 2) You may **download** an application form as a PDF file from our website, print it out, fill it in, and mail it back to us.


