

Lydia Mendoza, Guest Artist AFF 1979

LYDIA MENDOZ

Many folks remember that Merle Travis was our first guest to her family signing a recordartist but who remembers the unique guest artist for the fifth annual Alaska Folk Festival in 1979? She was known as the "Lark of the Border" and her

appearance at the fifth festival broadened the spectrum of America's folk music for Alaskans.

Lydia Mendoza was a strong performer who asserted

her ethnic heritage while in Juneau by only speaking and singing in Spanish. Born in Houston, Texas of Mexican immigrants and musically talented from an early age, she began singing as a child with her family band in 1928. They played restaurants, street corners and fiestas on both sides of the border, passing the hat for food money. Lydia won a singing

contest on the radio which led ing contract with Bluebird Records. They later became one of the first Tejano groups recorded by major American label.

Lydia is best remembered

for her soulful voice accompanied only by her twelve-string guitar and she became a sensation in the 1940s and 1950s. As the "Singer of the Poor" and working class Ameri-

cans, she has been compared to the Carter Family. During a 60 year career she recorded over 50 LPs and 200 songs.

As a recipient of both the National Heritage Award (National Endowment for the Arts, 1982) and the National Medal of the Arts (President Clinton, 1999) she is justifiably recognized as one of America's great roots music singers. In

2007 she died at the age of 91. And in 2013 she was honored on the first US stamp issued in the Music Icon series, that has included Johnny Cash and Ray Charles. Lydia became the first Tehjana woman musician so honored.
